4 Day Itinerary to Ireland's Ancient East

We're delighted you have chosen Ireland for your performance group. Here is a selection of performance venues in Ireland's Ancient East and around the country.

Arrive Dublin Airport and depart for Co Kildare.

DAY 1

Morning Guided tour of <u>St Patrick's College Maynooth</u>, Ireland's medieval seat of power. Hear stories of 19th century scientist Nicholas Callan's renowned experiments and discoveries. Delve into the spine tingling mysteries of the Ghost room and visit St Patrick's House, designed by Pugin and constructed during the dark years of the Great Famine. Tour concludes in the College Chapel with its recently restored 3,106 pipe Ruffatti organ.

- **Afternoon** Tour of <u>Lullymore Heritage & Discovery Park</u>. Discover the wonders of Ireland's peatland; how bodies were ritually buried and preserved for 1,000s of years in the bogs; try your hand at cutting turf and discover the secrets of bog butter (authentic bog butter on display).

Late p.m. Visit the Irish National Stud and Japanese Gardens with its medley of stables, paddocks and gardens. Take a guided tour of the stud farm where you will meet champion race horses, spot mares and, in season, bandy legged foals! Meander through the Japanese Gardens, designed to represent the Life of Man. The gardens were created by Japanese master horticulturalist, Tassa Eida to help you adjust and adapt to a slower pace of life!

Check out how people lived at <u>The Tholsel</u> where people of the Middle Ages paid their taxes!

- **Afternoon** Visit <u>Kilkenny Castle</u> which stands dramatically on the River Nore, overlooking the high city of Kilkenny. The original Anglo-Norman castle was built during the 13th century for William Marshal, 4th Earl of Pembroke and the greatest knight that every lived (c.1146-1219). It then became the home of the Butler family for almost 600 years until 1957 when Arthur, 6th Marques of Ormonde, presented it to the people of Kilkenny in return for a token payment of £50!

First stop, University College Cork check out the award winning art and architecture at the Lewis Glucksmann Gallery and the Crawford Observatory, the only astronomical observatory in a university in Ireland. Visit the English Market, so called when the market was created in 1788 by the Protestant or 'English' corporation that controlled the city until 1841. Continue to St Ann's Church and find out why its clock is known locally as the Four Faced Liar. Try your hand at ringing the Shandon Bells.
